Following our work on two key studies and outreach projects for TCC Northeast, Project Partners was engaged to conduct an environmental scan of community needs and community resources for district-wide TCC Community Education (CE) Programs. Our team, experienced in higher education, professional development, strategic planning, and community engagement, followed our proven approach of "Assess. Analyze. Respond." We mined and assessed data sources and current program offerings, engaged stakeholders via focus groups and interviews, analyzed the findings, and presented a final report with detailed recommendations for this new phase of Community Education for TCC.

In 2021 and again in 2022, Project Partners worked with the COO of TCC and the ED of Human Resources to plan and facilitate retreats for TCCD HR leaders and staff. The retreats, designed to build relationships, confidence, skills, and understanding were held at the Fort Worth Botanic Gardens and at TCC Trinity River Campus.

2020, Project Partners provided an evaluation and In recommendations for the STEPS Transitional Skills Program at TCC Northeast Campus, which helps individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities fulfill their life goals - addressing academic skills, employability, social skills, and self-sufficiency. Using a systematic research and problem-solving model, our work included analysis of current program policies and practices through development and implementation of interviews of stakeholder groups and individuals. We also identified best practices for program design in similar higher education programs as well as reviewed state standards for the delivery of transitional skills programs. We conducted a SWOT analysis and compiled all findings and recommendations into a written report which was presented to the campus president and the STEPS team.

In 2021, we conducted an environmental scan of community needs and resources specific to the TCC Northeast student population and delivered the findings to the Executive Director of TCC Northeast's Continuing Education and Engagement Division. The results will help inform the Division's strategic plan and programming.




CONSULTING WORK FOR THE IDD (INTELLECTUAL OR DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES) PROGRAM '23 Tarrant County College South Campus

Building on a series of projects for Tarrant County College over several years, Project Partners provided an evaluation and recommendations for the IDD programs at TCC South Campus, which help individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities fulfill their life goals. By providing education in a college setting, the A Step Above and A Step Beyond programs prepare students who are leaving high school for life as a young adult, while developing both technical and soft skills that assist with the transition to college, foster job skills, and promote independence. Using systematic research, our work included analysis of current program delivery through the development and execution of interviews of stakeholder groups and individuals. We also identified best practices for program design in similar higher education programs, as well as the level of need in the community, evaluating the TCC South programs against those metrics. Finally, a SWOT analysis was conducted, and all findings and recommendations were written into a comprehensive report which was presented to the campus president and program leadership.

CONSULTING WORK FOR THE INTELLECTUAL OR DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES (IDD) PROGRAM '23 Tarrant County College Southeast Campus
